With the expansion of sports betting in Vermont, it is more important than ever to help people struggling with gambling harm. The **Vermont Department of Mental Health** has partnered with the Institute for Consumer Health to increase treatment availability.

Vermont Problem Gambling Specialist Certificate program builds statewide capacity to respond to the needs of clients seeking treatment for gambling disorders as their primary or secondary diagnosis. This no-cost Certificate documents that the clinician possesses evidence informed tools for screening, assessing, and treating gambling disorders within their clinical populations.

Vermont Problem Gambling Specialist Certificate is a professional development opportunity, offered at no cost for clinicians serving Vermont clients. It can help providers identify themselves as a problem gambling resource and demonstrates proficiency in addressing gambling disorder.

Holders of the VT Certificate have the opportunity to have their treatment agency or private practice be listed as a referral source on the Vermont Gambling Helpline.

First-time Applications Require:

Master's or doctoral degree with clinical supervision or independent licensure

Proof of clinical supervision or independent licensure.
